Over 1500 engineers, scientists, and students will be attending the 2009 IEEE AP-S and URSI International Symposium to be held at the Charleston Convention Center the week of June 1st.

We came here partly due to the proximity of major educational institutions and also so that we can share with our international colleagues the unique charm of the Charleston area,” said Anthony Q. Martin, General Chair of the Symposium and Clemson University Professor.

The conference features nearly 1500 technical presentations on antennas, propagation, and radio; sixteen half- and full-day short courses on related technical topics; exhibits from over 20 international companies; and an awards banquet honoring distinguished members. The conference was scheduled specifically to coincide with major cultural events in Charleston such as the Spoleto USA Festival.
